Dear church family,

We are now well into advent, the advent calendars are underway, and in the Patten household there is a sense that the end of term is coming and that right behind follows Christmas. Advent is best described as a time of waiting with expectation. Admittedly it's a bit artificial giving that we know we aren't waiting for Christ to come anymore, but as we wait to celebrate with our families, there is still something profound and amazing about celebrating Christmas every year. Even though we may have celebrated in the same way year in, year out.

It is in keeping the real meaning of Christmas front and centre of our celebrations that we avoid being sucked into the consumerist whirlpool that is Christmas shopping.
